Three more held in poaching of 10 leopards

In connection with the ongoing probe into the poaching of 10 leopards from Sheopur and Morena, State Tiger Strike Force (STSF) has taken three suspects on a production warrant from Agra court. So far, 12 accused have been held, and they are from three different states. The role of a co-founder of a Delhi-based NGO is also being examined in the case. A summons has been served on him

asking him to appear before the investigating agency on Aug 24. So far, the investigation indicates that the suspects were lured by someone to kill the leopards for their valuable skin. Hitherto, there is no lead which could pinpoint that the demand to kill leopards was made on behalf of any international racket. The people involved in the killing of the leopard are saying that they only got the order in lieu of Rs 10,000 to Rs 20,000 and they killed leopards through leg traps.

BMC suspends assistant accountant over POS machine irregularities

The Bhopal Municipal Corporation (BMC) on Friday suspended Assistant Accountant Sanjay Singh Parihar of the Revenue Branch for alleged negligence and irregularities in handling Point-of-Sale (POS) machines used for revenue collection.

The action followed an inspection of Zone No. 19 under the Jan Vishwas Abhiyan on August 21.

During the inspection, it was found that POS machines were not available in all wards, affecting revenue collection.

According to the suspension order, staff informed officials that the machines had been handed over to Parihar for activation but had not

been returned. A private bank POS machine was reported as inactive, but the bank manager confirmed that it was already active.

The order further states that another private bank had provided POS machines to Parihar on August 10.

He allegedly retained them for 10 days and distributed them without the knowledge or approval of senior officials. When contacted by phone, Parihar reportedly failed to provide a clear explanation.

The BMC held that his conduct amounted to negligence in an important assigned task and disregard for senior officers' directions. Parihar has been suspended with immediate effect, and will remain headquartered in the Planning Branch.

Four booked for attempted murder after sword attack

A man suffered serious injuries after four youths allegedly attacked him and his two sons with swords following an argument over obscene comments in the Bagsewan area on Thursday night, said police on Friday.

According to police, Mayank Singh, a resident of Durga Nagar, was heading towards a ground with a friend around 8 pm when three to four youths near a checkpoint allegedly passed obscene comments at him. When Mayank objected, the suspects allegedly assaulted him.

Mayank informed his family, following which his brother Ashish Singh and father Kunwar Singh reached the spot. During the confrontation, the suspects allegedly attacked them with swords. Kunwar sustained a severe head injury and collapsed. Bystanders intervened, prompting the attackers to flee. Kunwar was rushed to hospital, while his two sons sustained minor injuries. Based on Ashish's complaint, police registered a case of attempted murder against Vishal, Ravi, Akash and their associates. The suspects, reportedly residents of Anna Nagar, are yet to be arrested.

He directed officials to conduct door-to-door health surveys in all villages in the area and health staff to examine children's health and vac-

inate them against chronic diseases.

He said the health department and field staff should maintain continuous surveillance in the villages and provide medical aid whenever symptoms of any illness crop up.

During the inspection, the Bithli Sarpanch raised demand for construction of roads from Bithli to Harranala, Amanala and Chukka Tola, and electricity to Duglai village.

Member of Parliament Bharti Pardhi and officials of the district administration remained present during the inspection.

MPHRC awards Rs 5 lakh ex-gratia in Ashoknagar jail suicide case

BHOPAL: Madhya Pradesh Human Rights Commission has directed the jail department to provide Rs 5 lakh ex-gratia to the family of a 23-year-old man who died by suicide in Ashoknagar jail in 2020, officials said on Friday. The victim, Neelam Lal aged 23 years, resident of Bamori Tanka of Ashoknagar district was in the jail. He committed suicide on Aug 2, 2020 in morning at around 10 am. The matter was heard by the Commission and the Commission decided to provide Rs 5 lakh to the family.

Man from Mandsaur arrested with MD drugs worth Rs 26L

INDORE: City Crime Branch arrested a man allegedly involved in the supply of MD drugs and seized drugs worth around Rs 25.90 lakh in the international market from his possession, police said on Friday.

DCP (Crime) Rajesh Tripathi said that the suspect was identified as Mohammad Al-tamas, a resident of Mandsaur district. Police said they intercepted him during a check near Metro Line pillars at Super Corridor.

He was riding a black motorcycle. During a search, police found a transparent plastic packet containing 259 grams of MD drugs near the petrol tank under the motorcycle seat.

325 cartons of liquor worth Rs 41L seized

The Sehore police confiscated 325 cartons of foreign-made liquor being sent to Gujarat on Friday, official sources said.

The police action came on the heels of the death of nine people after consuming spurious liquor in Bhavnagar, Gujarat.

To hoodwink the police, the liquor traffickers scattered cement on the truck and made set up a big box to keep liquor.

When the police received a tip-off about the truck, superintendent of police Sonakshi Saxena formed a team which stopped the truck on the Bilkisganj-Jhagriya road near

Barkhedi village.

The rear portion of the truck remained scattered with cement, indicating that an empty truck returning him.

When the police strictly questioned them, the traffickers opened the gate of the box adjacent to the frontal portion of the truck.

The driver of the truck Babloo Chouhan and cleaner Sinaakar Mandloi whom the police arrested live in the Jobat area of Alirajpur district.

According to additional superintendent of police Prashant Choube said they launched a campaign against illegal sale of liquor in the district by checking the suspicious vehicles.

Hindu groups allege police inaction in minor girl's abduction case

Hindu organisations, including Bajrang Dal activists, staged a protest outside the Jahangirabad police station on Friday, alleging police inaction in the alleged abduction of a minor girl from Rajgarh district.

Police register zero FIR, recover girl and arrest one suspect after protest

The protesters claimed that the girl was allegedly lured away by a man identified as Arsan, who subsequently shared her mobile number with Anas, who allegedly took her to Bhopal. Activists demanded strict action against both suspects and raised allegations of "love jihad". The pro-

test continued for around an hour, with activists demanding registration of an FIR and recovery of the minor.

Police subsequently registered a zero FIR, recovered the girl and arrested Anas, according to SHO Rajan Singh Ahirwar. The suspect is being interrogated, while further investigation is underway. SHO

Ahirwar further said the circumstances surrounding the girl's movement from Pilukhedi in Rajgarh to Bhopal and the alleged involvement of both suspects are being investigated. The case has been registered against both suspects, and further legal action will follow based on the investigation.

Cases against nine for threatening to set police FRV on fire

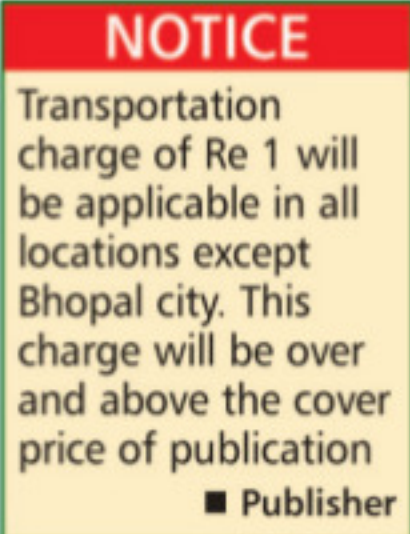
The police have registered cases against more than half a dozen people for allegedly stopping the FRV (First Response Vehicle) of the Bagra Police Outpost under Makhan Nagar Police Station, threatening to set it on fire, and obstructing government work.

According to reports, head constable Kailash Keer of the Bagra Tawa police outpost received information about an incident in the village of Pothiya.

He reached the spot with his staff in an FRV vehicle. Afterwards, when they took some people to the police station in the vehicle, more than a dozen people stopped the vehicle on the way.

The people said to the police to take them to the police station. Keer, who was present at the spot, explained to them that they would first drop the people at the police station and then return to take them.

They allegedly refused to listen to him and started abusing the FRV driver and



Keer. They also threatened to set the vehicle on fire.

As the situation became tense, the head constable informed senior police officials. Police personnel subsequently reached the spot and acted against the crowd.

The police said on the basis of the complaint by Keer, the senior officials registered cases against Sunil Pandey, Emon Pandey, Narendra Uike, Rajkumar Ivne, Jagdish Uike, Ashok Ivne, Jitendra Maskole, Vinod Ivne and Ajay Ivne, all residents of Pothiya village.

The police booked them for obstructing government work, threatening to set the FRV on fire, and abusing police personnel.

Villagers protest against power disconnection

A large number of villagers, including Janpad head Raju Singh and BJP Mandal president Lakshmi Prasad Dar Kesh, staged a sit-in outside the Karanja electricity office on Friday against the disconnection of power supply in Chandu Van Tola on Thursday night.

The also submitted a memorandum to the Naib Tehsildar, a revenue official. They wanted know from the power officials the reasons for punishing the power consumers by disconnecting the supply.

The village has 100 power consumers, Singh said, adding that because of 36 consumers who failed to foot the power bills, others had to suffer.

Consequently, those who paid the power bills, too, had to suffer. During the rainy season, the villagers had to spend a sleepless night for no fault of

theirs, Singh said.

He said the power distribution company should have served a notice before disconnecting the supply.

The sudden disruption in power supply also affected the household work at night. The protesters also said under Section of the Electricity Act, 2003 the officials should follow procedures before disconnecting the power supply.

Although the villagers informed junior engineer

Kamal Patel about the problem they faced, he failed to solve it, forcing them to resort to agitation.

On the other hand, official sources said they disconnected the supply as the residents did not foot the power bills.

According to executive engineer RK Baghel there are 36 consumers connected to the transformer serving Chandu Van Tola, but only two of them paid the power bills.

The company has instructed the officials to disconnect the supply in villages where 90% of the bills remain unpaid, and that the officials acted accordingly, Baghel said.
