ASIAN GAMES CUT
LEAVES WUSHU,
JUDO ATHLETES
CRYING FOUL

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NEW DELHI: The Sports Authority of India's decision to prune the Asiad contingent has irked several federations. Many federations are pointing out at the "ambiguity" in selection based on rankings, especially for squads picked on the basis of open trials.

Several sports, including tennis, rowing, judo, gymnastics, and weightlifting, have had their squads trimmed. SAI stuck to the ministry's selection criteria of at least top-6 finish at the Asian Championships or previous Asian Games as benchmark for individual athletes. For team sports, the benchmark was set at a top-8.

In wushu, for example, a squad of 12 was selected based on trials. SAI objected to five of them, Mercy Ngaimong, and the athletes have been omitted. "It is possible that in open trials, the athlete who wins in a weight class may not match the top-six (criteria)," said a Wushu Association of India official.

Even Arunachal Pradesh CM Pema Khandu wrote to sports minister Mansukh Mandaviya asking him to consider Ngaimong based on her performance in the trials. Ngaimong, one of the leading wushu player won two gold medals at the 7th Nordic Open, Stockholm last year and silver in women's Jianshu at Oceania International Championship at Brisbane and at Moscow Wushu Stars.

In judo, only three of the 12 names have been approved, leaving out Glasgow Commonwealth Games gold medalist Harsh Singh and bronze medalist Unnati Sharma.

"They could have at least considered medal winners from the CWG. We have a scenario where CWG medal winners are not in the team, and those who have not won medal are in the team. Naturally, the CWG medal winners are shattered," said a judo official.

In tennis, five players have been excluded, including promising Vaishnavi Adkar and Manas Dhamne. That has led Rohan Bopanna question the selection process.

Of belief and hope: Djokovic begins his Slam quest, again

The last time Novak won a Slam was at the US Open in 2023 but he's been more than competitive since

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MUMBAI: The last time Novak Djokovic played a competitive singles tennis match, he spent quite a while bent down in pain. Often, he vomited into towels as he struggled with the heat and humidity at the Cincinnati Masters.

Yet, he refused to walk away mid-match, losing 6-2, 6-4, 6-4 against world No.50 Thiago Agustín Tirante in a match that lasted two hours and 44 minutes. Since then though, he has had a lot more screentime, more so as the subject of the documentary 'Novak Djokovic: The World in Winter.'

In one particular sequence of the film, he addresses a topic that has been a raging debate across tennis in the past few years. "I know a lot of people are retiring me already, for many years," Djokovic said in the documentary. "Why would you want me to retire when I am still playing and competing at the highest level? I'm still top 5, top 10 in the world."

As it stands, he is the world No.5. And at the US Open that begins on Sunday, he will compete as the fourth seed. He may not be the overwhelming favourite, yet he remains a player who cannot be written off. The last time Djokovic won a Grand Slam was at the US Open in 2023. It was his 24th Major title, bringing him level with Margaret Court for the joint-all time record. Since then, the 25th Slam has remained elusive, as he has become a step-slower with age, while his biggest opponents today, Jannik Sinner and Carlos Alcaraz, have taken control of the



new world order of men's singles tennis. Djokovic now wants to produce his best at the Grand Slams. He may not have won a title in his last 11 attempts at the Majors, but his record at the Slams has still been impressive.

Since that triumph in New York in 2023, the Serbian's Grand Slam results include two third round finishes, one quarter-final, six semi-finals and the 2024 Wimbledon and 2026 Australian Open

finals. These results include a walkover (to Casper Ruud in the quarter-final of the French Open in 2024) and a mid-match retirement (against Alexander Zverev at the 2025 Australian Open semi-final). It also includes four defeats to current world No.1 Sinner and three to Alcaraz.

The only anomalies were defeats to then world No.28 Alexei Popyrin (third round of US Open 2024) and to then world No. 30

Joao Fonseca, in the third round of the French Open earlier this year.

These are performances most players would dream of, but Djokovic holds himself to higher standards. "Whenever Novak enters any tournament, or a Major, he'll be in it with a shot. Not just once, not just here, he's done it every place, and at the highest levels," Roger Federer, one of Djokovic's great rivals, said ahead of the US Open. "I always think that as long

as he's in the draw, there's a chance. That's one of the reasons he's still playing, because he truly must believe that he can still do it."

To better prepare himself for the Slams, Djokovic has actively been truncating his tennis calendar. In 2024, he played in 12 tournaments, which included the triumph at the Paris Olympics and a single Davis Cup match. In 2025, he played in 13 tournaments. But in an injury-laden 2026, he has played in only three competitions so far, including the opening round loss at Cincinnati.

"It's just a condition that I have, health-wise, that has been bothering me for the past couple of years," Djokovic said after losing to Tirante. "(It causes) a lot of issues, especially when it is humid and it is hot."

He may have to deal with those conditions again, with New York often being hot and humid at this time of the year. As for dealing with nerves though, he is a different beast. He often wins the mental battle before even taking to the court – especially in the gruelling best-of-five set matches. What he's been struggling with of late though is the physical aspect.

That has led to a few changes to his game style. A defensive baseliner at heart, he no longer prefers longer rallies. And so, he tends to mix-up play, throwing in drop shots and charging up to the net."

"Survive to thrive," he said, after reaching the quarter-final at Wimbledon this year. "Hopefully the thriving part is coming."

Since winning his first Grand Slam title, at the Australian Open in 2008, Djokovic has never gone three consecutive seasons without winning a Major. The US Open will, in one way or another, mark a first for him – either a third season without a Slam, or a new world record.

He will hope the thriving part is indeed coming soon.

India must master more Olympic sports: PM Modi

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday said India must expand its base and participate in more sporting disciplines to enhance its medal prospects at the Olympics.

Modi was speaking to participants at the Khelo India Samvaad via video conference, addressing youth and athletes who connected from over 5,000 institutes across the country as part of the National Sports Day 2026 celebrations.

"Other countries are winning medals in sports where India does not even participate; we must master these sports as well which is important to increase our medal tally," said PM Modi.

"The bitter truth is that we don't even compete in half the sporting disciplines at the Olympics, which means that we are not competing for a big part of the medal tally, and it has been happening for decades. In the 2012 Olympics, India participated in just 13 sports and did not compete in more than 20 events. Other countries win medals in these sports and we don't even take part.

"To increase our medal tally we have to participate in sports such as surfing, sport climbing etc. We have such a huge coastline and mountainous region that such sports should come naturally to us. Whether it is watersports or

winter sports, we have the demography and the geography but we are not seen in such sports globally. So we have to find opportunities in districts where we can develop an ecosystem for such sports," Modi said.

"When we speak about preparation for the 2036 Olympics preparation our focus should be that we should prepare athletes who in 2036 can compete in different sports qualify and compete. I announced from the Red Fort (August 15) that we will have a talent hunt programme for ages 5-15 to introduce them to different sports."

Modi said sports is not just about winning medals but its purpose is also nation-building. "When I talk about sports, it isn't just about winning medals, it is a campaign to integrate India's sports power and youth energy to build a Viksit Bharat. I have always said, 'Those who play will blossom.'"
